## relebrating Age Festival

We started out the year by being invited to take part in Age UK's "Celebrating Age Festival" at the M-shed. This was a first for GayWest or indeed for any LGBT group and went very well, so we were invited back again this year which was held on September 18<sup>th</sup>.

This was the beginning of the change that I think is taking place in the community, a gradual acceptance in the wider society as a whole, as we saw at the Pride events this past year where there were more family orientated stalls and a mixture of cultures. Although unfortunately we noticed that GayWest was the only LGBT social group having a stall at some of these prides.

The M-Shed was visited again in February when we took part in the "Schools Out National History Month" and GayWest presented a talk on it's amazing history.

### **GayWest Support**

GayWest as a group has expanded it's support activities this year by giving support to setting up a GBT group at Leyhill open prison which we are actively involved with at the moment and working with Ashley h House in Bristol on helping gay prisoners on their re-habitation into society on their release from prison.

### Social events

On the social side, our monthly social evenings in Bristol have been well attended and are a regular feature in our diary. Unfortunately we have stopped the Bath monthly social evening due to lack of support. In May we had a trip on the Bristol Packet boat around the harbour which all those who took part enjoyed, also we had a different type of event in June, also at the Harbourside and this was what I like to call GayWest's (first queer) ale pub crawl although we only managed two pubs but a nice afternoon it was. Later in August we had our first picnic for a while and this was at Conham River Park next to Hanham Woods, we also had a very interesting guided walk at this event showing the highlights of this wooded area.

## **DORIS KAPPELHOFF**

Doris was born on April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1924 in Cincinnati; her parents were of Dutch origin, and along with her two siblings, the family were settled and enjoyed a popular social life. Doris' aim in life was to be a dancer and she formed a dance duo with Jerry Doherty and they had a lot of success. But it was not to be! In October 1937 whilst out driving with friends, the car was involved in a major crash and Doris' legs were shattered, which prompted the surgeon to say that she may never walk again. She spent months recuperating and became restless; her mother suggested that perhaps she might like to sing to while away the time: Doris took the advice and progressed under the tuition of Grace Raine. A talent scout heard her, and offered her a spot on a local radio station. At this point in her life, she changed her name to Doris Day. The rest, as they say, is history.

She sang with different bands including Les Brown and had her first hit recording of "Sentimental Journey" in 1945. Films followed and she first appeared in "Romance on the High Seas" in 1947. She signed a multiyear contract with Warner Brothers, and so her career as a screen actress began. She made numerous comedy films and was type-cast as virginal.

She played opposite some of the biggest names in Hollywood, including Howard Keel, Cary Grant, Rock Hudson, Clark Gable, Rod Taylor, Gordon MacRae, Rex Harrison and many others. In the 1953 film "Calamity Jane" she had a world-wide hit with the song "Secret Love". Two years later she filmed in London for Alfred Hitchcock's spy thriller "The Man Who Knew Too Much" and had another world-wide hit song with "Que Sera Sera".

In all, she appeared in 39 films, the last of which was made in 1968. Thereafter she retired from the screen, but she did continue her recoding career and appeared in her own television series. In her home town of Carmel in California with dedicated staff, she started The Doris Day Animal Foundation looking after stray animals. This continues today and is Doris' main focus in life. She was married four times, and had a son Terry who predeceased her. In 2015 there were rumours that she was to appear in a new film to be directed by Clint Eastwood.

She celebrated her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2014. Her films are regularly shown on television and continue to delight new generations.
