We have looked at this and have decided to not renew the GayWest PO Box address (to be renewed in march 2017) this will save around £250.00p for the year.

Also due to a very small committee and the amount of work that has to be shared amongst them it has been decided to reduce the Magazine to six issues a year instead of twelve. There will be a larger 16 page edition (Currently, the monthly Magazine has 12 pages). The advantages of this is that there will be less pressure on the magazine editors each month, and will save £238.00p a year in printing cost.

The Website is a very interactive site and GayWest was able to get such an advanced site due to a very good grant in 2014, and at the time that a social club website was being tested and GayWest was the first to trial it. We wish to use this to the our advantage which is why we have asked all those who receive the magazine on line to access the site in its members section for the magazine and also we hope soon to start putting more publications and information there.

Remember our Twitter account and Facebook pages can be accessed via the website, and of course we have to pay for the site annually so start using it.

Now then, before we end this year there is still time to book your Christmas dinner if you haven't done so already, We have managed to keep the Prices as last year, £20.00 for members and £25.00 for guests. This year we have very different guests to help us, for you to enjoy, so I hope you can join us in the Christmas fun.


As this is my last Blog for 2016 I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a happy New Year form myself and your GayWest committee.
